7 DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1

Montauk, New York to Block Island – Board M/Y Serque at the picturesque Montauk Lake Club for the first day of cruising to Block Island. Block Island is an excellent place for biking, birding and learning about Captain Kidd’s buried treasures (according to Block Island history). Having a history dating back to the early 1600’s, in 1614, Adrian Block, a Dutch explorer, sailed to the island and gave it his name. He called it Block Island and it was in 1661 that the Island was settled. Early American red brick homes dot the island, which showcases beautiful beaches, migratory birds as well as wonderful food.

DAY 2

Block Island to Newport, RI – Newport is a city set on Aquidneck Island in the New England state of Rhode Island. The sailing capital of the USA, its yacht-filled harbor hosted the America’s Cup, a renowned annual sailing regatta, for many years. Newport is also known for the Gilded Age mansions lining Bellevue Avenue, some of which are now museums. The most famous is The Breakers, an 1895 mansion patterned after a Renaissance palace. Enjoy a taste of old New England.

DAY 3 - 4

Martha’s Vineyard – Martha's Vineyard, a Massachusetts island, sits in the Atlantic just south of Cape Cod. A longtime New England summer colony, it encompasses harbor towns and lighthouses, sandy beaches and farmland. It's accessible only by boat or air. Vineyard Haven, on the eastern end, is a ferry port and the island's commercial center. An island of contrasts, including sophisticated Edgartown, where “Jaws” was filmed. Choose to visit scenic coastal Chappaquiddick (“Chappy”), Oak Bluffs with its charming

Gingerbread houses, Vineyard Haven (a “dry” town), Menemsha fishing village, and Gay Head, home to the Wampanoag Indian tribe.

DAY 4 - 5

Nantucket – Nantucket, a tiny, isolated island off Cape Cod, Massachusetts, is a summer destination with dune-backed beaches. It’s marked by unpainted cedar-shingled buildings, many surrounded by manicured privets. The wharves and cobblestoned streets of the Town of Nantucket are lined with restaurants, high-end boutiques and steeped churches. A historic whaling port, her main streets are preserved in the style of the centuries-old Age of Sail.

DAY 6

Cuttyhunk Island - Cuttyhunk Island is the outermost of the Elizabeth Islands in Massachusetts. A small outpost for the harvesting of sassafras, it was occupied for a few weeks in 1602, arguably making it the first English settlement in New England. Summer residents and visitors enjoy the island’s beaches and natural beauty, but most of all its quiet and solitude. Cuttyhunk’s natural harbor is a popular spot for boaters to tie up for a night or even a summer. Cuttyhunk continues to be a popular site for sportfishing, with striped bass and bluefish being the most frequent catches. Lobstering is an occupation for a few of the island’s residents, as is boat building, shell fishing, and carpentry.

DAY 7

Montauk, NY – From Mystic, a short cruise will take you back to Montauk Lake Club, where you will depart Serque, having made new friends and memories of a great New England experience.
